Digital Libraries (DL) is the object of research and elaborations aiming to create theory and practice to collect, spread, store, search and analyze digital content of different provenance. These modern repositories of knowledge look like complicated online information systems.

The series of the All-Russian scientific conferences RCDL is presented on the site <http://rcdl.ru>. They aimed at the formation of the Russian corps of the global DL community of scientists. Scientific Digital Libraries play an important role in actively promoted initiatives of the scientific community in providing of the open access to research results and in the formation of the open science.

A traditional seminar of young scientists “Thesis research on the subjects of information technologies connected to digital libraries” is co-located with the Conference. Those authors whose reports have been selected during preliminary review will be given a possibility to present the results of their current research and to discuss strong and weak points of their reports with more experienced colleagues.

Working languages are Russian and English. Extended abstracts and papers can be in any of them. The Program Committee expects the original papers, not published earlier and having a research orientation.

Conference Proceedings will be published as a collection of texts of accepted full papers, short papers and abstracts of posters, as well as in electronic form on the constant [RCDL site](#). The texts of full reports will be also accessed and stored in the European Repository of Conference Proceeding [CEUR Workshop Proceedings](#). Moreover, the best reports of the Conference will be recommended for publication (debug version) in editions included into the list of Higher Attestation Commission of Russia (VAK).

May 15th, 2014 – the submission deadline for extended abstracts, at least 2000 words including references, in **Russian or English**.

May 20th, 2014 – the deadline for applications of tutorials and co-located workshops.

June 15th, 2014 – before this date the authors will be notified on the status of their submissions (accepted / rejected).

August 1st, 2014 – the deadline for camera-ready versions of the accepted papers.
